Midweek Chapel & Mission Offering: Each Wednesday (8:15 am) throughout the school year, Trinity conducts a midweek chapel service. This year's chapel focuses around the theme, "Walk with God! Talk with God!". All mission offerings collected at our Wednesday morning chapel services will go to WELS Campus Ministry. To date we have collected \$299.22. We encourage and invite all of our preschool and K-8 parents and families to join the students for this 15-minute service each week.
