Cross Country: For those of you who will be running in the cross country meet on Saturday, September 23; We will be having practice during 2nd recess on Tuesdays and Thursdays every week until the race. Church Attendance: Every week, church attendance will be taken in kindergarten through 8th grade. Its intent is to encourage an active worship life in our school families. Please make weekly worship the highlight of your week.

Sunday School and Bible Class: Classes resumed this past Sunday. They are both conducted each Sunday following our 9:00 am worship service (10:30 am). Sunday School is for student in preschool through 4th grade. Bible Class is for 5th-8th grade, high school students, and adults. All are welcome to attend as often as possible!

Midweek Chapel: Each Wednesday (8:15 am) throughout the school year, Trinity conducts a midweek chapel service. We encourage and invite all of our preschool and K-8 parents and families to join the students for this 15-minute service each week. This year's chapel focuses around the theme, "Walk with God! Talk with God!".

Mission Offering 2022-2023: This past week, the students in grades K-8 voted on where they would like their mission offerings to go at the end of the year. This year they chose WELS Campus Ministry. This is mission that young college students utilize for spiritual comfort, fellowship, and worship. WELS Campus Ministry provides resources and support to hundred of congregations that serve these college students. Trinity's own visitation pastor, Pastor Glenn Schwanke, served in this way for 25 years in Houghton, Michigan. Last week, we collected \$23.66.
