Keep It Simple

Martin Luther didn't want to start a new church. He definitely did not want a new church named after himself: "The first thing I ask is that people should not make use of my name, and should not call themselves Lutherans but Christians. What is Luther? The teaching is not mine. Nor was I crucified for anyone...How did I, poor stinking bag of maggots that I am, come to the point where people call the children of Christ by my evil name?"

But it happened. And the Lutheran church remains to this day. For good reason. Luther kept things simple. His focus was laser-like on one entity: Christ

Christ alone saves. Add anything to Christ, and you end up without Christ. This simple, powerful, saving message had been all but lost at Luther's time. Christianity was anything but Christ-centered. The church of Martin Luther's day proclaimed Christ, but the message was Christ plus something. Christ plus indulgences. Christ plus works. Christ plus penance. Christ plus piety. Christ plus prayer. But to add anything at all to Christ is to end up with nothing at all. Christ plus something = nothing.

Christ plus something equals nothing at all, because, if the way to heaven is Christ plus something, then the law is a part of salvation. But I can't keep God's law. No one can. "No one will be declared righteous in his sight by works of the law, for through the law we become aware of sin." (Romans 3:20) In fact, the more we try to be right with God, the more we give him our efforts, the further we are lost.

Luther knew the feeling. He lived it the first half of his life. He anguished over the fact that he could not do enough (really, anything!) to be right with God. Sin and guilt stood in the way for him and for us; an impenetrable, immovable, unclimbable barrier. But then, Luther discovered this, "But now, completely apart from the law, a righteousness from God has been made known. The Law and the Prophets testify to it. This righteousness from God comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all and over all who believe." (Romans 3:21,22)

The righteousness that saves does not come from us. It is not found in the world. It comes from God. It's a gift from God through faith, as it is found only in Christ.

Luther: "There are some ministers who imagine that they cannot be preachers unless they teach more than Christ and above the level of our preaching. These are the ambitious eccentrics, who forsake our simplicity and rush on with their peculiar wisdom, so that people cast admiring glances at them and exclaim: What a preacher! They should be sent to Athens, where people desired to hear something new every day. They seek their own honor, not Christ's; therefore they will also end in shame. Beware of them and stay with Paul, who desired to know nothing save Christ and him crucified."

Keep it simple. Keep the focus on Christ. Is this true of Lutherans today? Of Christianity at large? Or has the faith again become cluttered and complicated, clouding the Christ? Do you have simple, childlike faith? Is this enough?

Simple isn't silly. It's sacred. Seek simple. Cling to Christ...alone.


