#### Though Devils All The World Should Fill!

It's October. That means Hollywood will be rolling out a new crop of Halloween horror movies. **"Friday the 13th: Part 317." "A Nightmare on Elm-Street: The final, final chapter-we really mean it this time!"** Freddie Krueger and Michael Myers will lurk in the shadows. Young teens will walk into pitch-black rooms, yet no one will ever turn on a light. There will be violence and gore. It's creepy stuff—a movie formula that I can live without. I don't want to be spooked by every shadow in a dark room or hallway.

Yet some Halloween movies are even worse. "The Omen." "The Exorcist." "Poltergeist." "Hellraiser." "The Last Voyage of the Demeter." I find zero entertainment value in a film about the devil or his demons. Why? Because I know the devil and his demons are real. God's Word warns me the devil is a "roaring lion seeking whom he may devour." (1 Peter 5:8) So how can I find the antics of the Prince of this World entertaining? I know that nothing but hate drives him, and the only purpose of his miserable existence is to drag me down with him into hell!

I want nothing to do with Satan. I pray you feel the same. Yet, as dangerous as the devil may be, we need not cower in fear under our beds because of him. Dr. Martin Luther knew that. When he wrote his famous Reformation hymn, "A Mighty Fortress is our God," Luther penned these lines. "Though devils all the world should fill, All eager to devour us, We tremble not, we fear no ill, They shall not overpow'r us. This world's prince may still Scowl fierce as he will. He can harm us none. He's judged; the deed is done! One little word can fell him." (CW, 863:3)



Where were the devils in Luther's Day? Sadly, plenty of devils could be found hiding in the Church itself. There were those who taught that forgiveness of sins could be bought with pieces of paper called indulgences. Those who substituted the rules of man for the life-giving words of God. (Mark 7:7-9) Those who dared to curse with an "Anathema" anyone who taught salvation by grace alone, through faith alone, in Jesus alone.

In our day, there are also plenty of devils inside the Church. They are present whenever so-called Biblical scholars lecture us that the Bible isn't the inerrant, infallible, inspired word of God. Essentially, such teachers are mimicking the devil's age-old lie. "Did God really say?" (Gen. 3:1)

There are also plenty of devils outside the church. We are reminded of that tragic fact with every mass shooting, every terrorist bombing, and every secular attack on historic Christian values. But this need not cause us to shake like a leaf every time we turn off the lights. For we still have our fortress, our shield, and our weapon! We still have that one **Word** that can send the devil running.
