The God Who Watches Over You

A burglar broke into a house one night. He shined his flashlight around, looking for valuables. As he quietly picked up a laptop computer to place in his sack, a strange, disembodied voice echoed from the dark saying: "Jesus is watching you."

He nearly jumped out of his skin, shut the flashlight off, and froze. Had he really heard someone speaking? Was it his own conscience perhaps? When he heard nothing more after a bit, he shook his head and began searching for more valuables. Just as he grabbed an Ipad off a shelf, clear as a bell he hears: "Jesus is watching you."

Now, freaked out, he shines the light around frantically, looking for the source of the voice. Finally, in the corner of the room, the flashlight beam came to rest on a parrot. "Did you say that?" He hissed at the parrot. "Yep," the parrot squawked: "I'm just trying to warn you." The burglar relaxed "Warn me? Who in the world are you?" "Moses," replied the bird. "Moses?" the burglar laughed. "What kind of people would name a bird Moses?" The bird replies: "The kind of people that would name a Rottweiler Jesus."

Jesus as Rottweiler? There's an uncomfortable image. How about Jesus as interrogator or investigator? Do I want such a God to watch over me?

There is a key word in Psalm 121 that is repeated six times: "Watch." God is a watcher – not a disinterested observer or a stalker, but he watches over his people. The word in the original language has the idea of guarding and protecting. The Lord is a watchful guardian/protector of you and for you.

The first three times it occurs there's a current, present tense, "right now" aspect to this: "He who watches over you will not slumber. Yes, he who watches over Israel will not slumber. He will not sleep. The Lord watches over you." (vv.3b-5a) The final three times there's a future tense aspect to this – the encouragement is: Look to the Lord! "The Lord will watch to keep you from all harm. He will watch over your life. The Lord will watch over your going and your coming from now to eternity." (vv.7-8)

This is a fitting conclusion to a brief, powerful Psalm that begins with these words: "I lift up my eyes to the mountains. Where does my help come from? My help comes from the Lord, the Maker of heaven and earth." (vv. 1-2a)

Do I want such a God to watch over me? At all times? Am I comforted by the thought: "Jesus is watching you"? Yes, Yes, and Yes!

CHURCH SINGING GROUPS

Many members of our congregation have expressed their appreciation for the various groups that sang during the summer months. Those who participated in the singing have also expressed hopes for being able to continue. The results of this, both in participation and appreciation of those who heard the singing, have encouraged the Helwigs to continue to plan and provide opportunities for singing in one or more groups. Each of these opportunities are defined below.

Men's Hymn Sing: This group will continue to meet once a month on the 3rd Thursday at 6:30 pm. One exception is November when they'll meet on the 2nd Thursday. In addition to the Christian fellowship enjoyed while singing hymns together when they meet, they are scheduled to sing on Reformation Sunday, Sunday, November 19th, Thanksgiving Eve, and Christmas Eve.

The Festival Choir: This is a choir of mixed voices and is named because the group will sing for the festive services of Reformation, Thanksgiving, and Christmas Eve. They will meet once a month on the 2nd Tuesday at 6:30 pm. It is assumed that many who sing with this group are also those who meet to sing with the Men's Hymn Sing group. This mixed group of singers offers the women of our congregation an opportunity to participate while having to make only a once a month rehearsal commitment.

Select Groups: These are smaller groups (men, ladies, or both) of singers who have indicated a desire to sing in smaller groups from time to time. They are also singers who are likely able to read music or enjoy singing in harmony. Their musical gifts enable them to prepare to sing in church with less time needed for rehearsal. Their only meeting for practice would be before worship on the day they are scheduled to sing.

Soloists or Cantors: These are singers who have indicated an interest in assisting in the singing of the Psalms or in helping to introduce the singing of an unfamiliar hymn to the congregation. These singers provide our congregation with variation in the ways we can approach the singing of Psalms in our worship. They will work with the organists in their preparation for any given service.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Based on recent inquiries, Church Council is providing an overview to help educate our congregation on Trinity's financial funds. If you have questions or would like further information, contact the Stewardship Coordinator, John Bennett, at imbennett618@gmail.com or (715) 891-2029.

General Fund: Main pool of funds used for operations at Trinity. This is where offerings are

- deposited unless specified otherwise.
 School Restricted Fund: These funds are used to cover all school budget expenses in addition to
- cover all school budget expenses in addition to school expenses beyond the budget (for example, the school building updates done a few years ago).
- Building By God's Grace: This fund was originally created to help fund our building project and has been kept open to continue receiving donations that help cover property management expenses beyond the normal operating budget.
- **Operational Investment Account:** Pool of funds that are intended for large expenses beyond the resources available in the various funds mentioned above. Funds are invested in WELS Investment Funds and congregational approval is needed before funds can be used.
- Endowment Fund: The Endowment Committee oversees this fund which receives and administers bequests, estates and other assets with the objective to further extend God's Kingdom. Each year, up to 10% of funds are used to support various ministries, both within and outside our congregation.
- Student Tuition Fund: The Endowment Committee also oversees this fund. Purpose of fund is to support and encourage young people of our congregation in higher Christian Education. Provides financial assistance for attending one of our synodical schools or WELS-affiliated high schools.
